

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL AND IT'S PURPOSE

The school prepares boys and girls for CBSE Examination. The school aims at gradual vocationalization. In the primary section, the children are trained in fine arts, in the Middle, minor trades and in the High School major trades. The School provides facilities for development of every aspect of the child, looked after by trained and experienced teachers of various vocations and trades.

The School also has a plan to provide residential facilities both for boys and girls. The purpose of our boarding is to prepare children to live in this world successfully, facing day-to-day problems with ease and determination. They are given clear ideas based on sound moral principles. All facilities provided will be in conformity with today's living to enable them to execute their student life effectively. They are taught to live a simple life. They will be taught to live in any circumstances and conditions of life. What we provide is an atmosphere of love and concern for one another. Thus providing a climate for healthy and peaceful living. It will be a home away from home where they live with responsibility rather than waiting for holidays to come.

We have the following arrangements and programmes

- 5. Specific training on various sports and games according to the aptitudes of the children.

- 8. Regular picnics and excursions, giving them wider experience and knowledge of their country and the world around.

SCOPE OF THE CURRICULUM:

The scope of the curriculum is the framework of all learning experience of the educational programme. This is determined by analysis worthwhile human living to discover the essentials. It is necessary for the pupils to learn in order to be successful members of our democratic order. For learning purpose, these human experiences are classified into the following nine major functions of living, which serve as a working outline for developing curriculum activities.

- 1. Practicing Indian citizenship.
- 2. Using the tools of communications effectively.
- 3. Developing Economic competence
- 4. Improving family living
- 5. Protecting life and health
- 6. Building human relationships
- 7. Enjoying wholesome leisure
- 8. Satisfying spiritual and aesthetic needs
- 9. Meeting vocational responsibilities.

A MESSAGE TO PARENTS:

In order to secure all that is best in education and formation of your children, the maximum co-operation between parents and the school authorities is desired. Parents or guardians should look into their children's School calendar everyday, and see that the lessons and homework assigned for the next day are done. Children should be encouraged to cultivate the habits of neatness in their persons, clothes and books. They should be sent to school in the proper school uniform, punctually. As your children advance in age, guide them to become resourceful and useful members of both home and country Encourage self-help in work and study. The formation of work habits early in life inculcates the children about the idea of dignity of work, a fundamental, personal virtue for successful career in life.

General Instructions:

Parents are requested,

- 1. To co-operate with the School authorities in all matters pertaining to the education of their wards in the school.
- 2. To call on teachers only with the prior consent of the Principal after fixing up an appointment with him.
- 3. To see that their wards attend classes regularly throughout the academic year.
- 4. To see that their wards wear clean uniforms and attend classes on all working days punctually.
- 5. To see that their wards keep their text books, note Books etc., clean and tidy always during the year.
- 6. To look into the school Calendar every day and to see if there are any specific remarks by Teachers/ Principal regarding the behaviour, conduct, progress and achievement in studies etc., of their wards in the school.
- 7. To insist on their wards to take with them the school Calendar to the school everyday and to give a report every month on the progress of study at home in the pages provided.
- 8. To insist on their wards to develop in themselves good qualities like sincerity, honesty, industriousness, promptness, alertness, regularity, self-confidence, self-reliance, co-operation, tolerance and systematic work throughout the year.
- 9. To contact the Principal if there is any suggestion- to be made or any point to be clarified.

- 10. To remit school fees promptly as per schedule so that their wards may not lose attendance in the school during the year.
- 11. To send a written application to the Principal requesting for leave of absence whenever their wards are detained at home for any valid reason.
- 12. Not to disturb the teachers when in the class.
- 13. The school accepts no responsibility if a student who is obliged to return home during class hours for failure to comply with school regulations.
- 14. Visits to students or teachers by parents and other visitors are strictly forbidden. Permission is to be obtained from the Principal in unavoidable cases.
- 15. If special tuitions are required for any student, parents may contact the Principal and all such tuitions shall be arranged only through the school with the explicit permission of the Principal.
- 16. Presents to teachers or demonstrations in their honour which require the previous sanction of the Principal.
- 17. Before a student is withdrawn from the school, a month's notice is required. All such applications for T.C. must precede clearance of all dues to the school.
- 18. Parents/Guardians should keep themselves informed on school matters by carefully reading the regular letters from the school.
- 19. Failure of parents to co-operate with the school authorities in the education and discipline of their children in school may necessitate the removal of the child from the school rolls.
- 20. Costly ornaments such as gold, silver etc. are not to be worn in the School premises. In case of lost or theft the school is not responsible for the lost ornaments.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

On all school days, except on Saturdays, each boy and girl should wear the uniform.

House Dress: To be worn on all Wednesdays and Saturdays.

1. Every pupil must attend class regularly everyday.

2. All students must be present for the Assembly. Late comers will be severely punished and detained from the class.

3. Students are reminded that there must be perfect silence in the classrooms. The class teacher is responsible for the maintenance of order in the teacher's absence.

4. Students must take sufficient care of their personal appearance. A student coming to school without uniform will be refused admission to class.

5. Absentees will not be allowed to attend class next day without producing a valid 'Leave Letter'.

6. Students shall not be permitted to leave the compound during the working hours without the explicit permission of the Principal.

7. Students are forbidden to play, shout or run around in the classrooms. Students should never sit on the Teacher's chair in the classroom or on top of the desk.

8. Students must behave in a gentlemanly manner both inside and outside the school. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct.

9. Students must be up-to-date, in their work. The Principal may look into their books at any time.

10. Students are strictly forbidden to join any associations or clubs outside the school without the prior permission of the Principal. If permission is granted it shall be in writing by the Principal.

11. Any damage done to the school property will be made good by the one who had done it.

12. Pupils must supply themselves with all the necessary books and stationery before the re-opening of the school. A pupil who fails to get the necessaries within the appointed time will not be allowed to attend class.

13. Pupils are themselves responsible for their books, fountain pens, tiffin carriers or any other articles they bring to school. All these articles should bear the names of the owners.

14. When, due to illness or other unavoidable circumstances, a boy or girl is unable to prepare his lessons at home, he should bring a written note from his/her parents or guardian.

15. Whenever it is necessary, any teacher will enter remarks about a student's conduct, application or attendance in the place provided in the student's school Calendar. Such remarks should be initialed by the teacher entering them and also by the guardian as having seen the remarks.

16. Pupils absent from examination without grave reasons will be considered as having failed. Pupils absent from any examination will not be re-examined.

17. No textbooks, notebooks or other papers are to be brought to the examination hall. Students found copying or using unfair means during the examination or discovered subsequently, will be dealt severely. 18. Promotion may be denied to the students if in the opinion of the Principal, his attendance in each month is found unsatisfactory.

19. The students who want to continue their studies in the school should not be absent on the re-opening day without previous permission of the Principal. In any case they should pay the first installment of fees by the re-opening day. If not there is no guarantee of the seat.

20. Students are strictly forbidden to introduce any sort of comics and objectionable literature in to the school or to purchase any article of food from unauthorized dealers at or near the school premises.

21. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, neglect of homework, disobedience and disrespect towards members of the school staff or bad moral influence justify dismissal. Pupils are responsible to school authorities for their conduct both in and outside school.

ATTENDANCE

1. If a student is absent from school for 7 days or more, his attendance for the ,month fails below 75% or a student absent without permission for 7 days or more, is liable to have his name struck off the school roll, and will be re-admitted only on payment of a penalty admission fee.

2. LEAVE OF ABSENCE upto maximum of 6 days only will be granted by the Principal ON A PRIOR WRITTEN APPLICATION AND FOR SERIOUS REASONS ONLY. Parents taking their children away for marriages, festivals, holidays, tours etc., without prior permission of the Principal are acting against the school regulations and are liable to a penalty/admission fee.

3. If a student was absent on account of illness, he must bring a letter from his parent/guardian. For illness of more than 5 days the letter must be supported by a medical certificate.

4. All leave-notes and applications for leave must be written in the school calendar only. The same must be signed by the Principal before the class starts.

THE SCHOOL LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

1. Students must form the habit of reading good literature. The library books are available with respective class teachers.

2. Students should take proper care of the books. Damage or loss of books must be made good by the student concerned.

3. Students may make use of the reading-room at prescribed times. Magazines and periodicals are not to be taken out of the reading-room.

4. Silence is to be observed at all times in the reading room.

GAMES AND OTHER CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. Every student should play some outdoor games daily in order to build up a healthy body.

2. Self-defence (karate/Judo etc) is compulsory for all students of primary and above. Training in yoga begins at Std I.

3. Training in athletics and gymnastics with other physical training will be provided to all students. Without the prior permission of the Principal no student shall absent himself/herselffrom these trainings.

4. They should also take part in other activities such as elocution, debates, dramas, singing and essay competitions.

5. Those who selected for any team or contest are expected to be present whenever they are called. Any irregularity will not deprive the student of the certificate.

6. Physical training is compulsory for all students. Only those who are certified by a doctor to be physically unfit may be exempted by the Principal.

7. Students will be required on some occasions to be present for the March Past, PT, Display and Physical feats. Those who are absenting themselves on such occasions will be denied certificates for sports and games.

FINE ARTS AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING:

1. The school provides compulsory training in fine arts and vocational subjects. Training in fine arts is compulsory for all classes including Nursery.

2. Training in fine arts, music, dance and instruments is compulsory upto Grade V. From Grade VI specialization in fine arts begins.

3. Progress reports will be issued for the fine arts and vocational subjects. Students failing in these subjects will not be promoted. This will not relate to their academic performances.

4. There will be separate examinations for fine arts and vocational subjects and separate certificates will be issued on the basis of the particular course of training in each subject.

5. Each student has to possess necessary tools related to the particular trade in which he/she is undergoing training.

6. Students who undergo training in musical instruments must possess their own instruments. They have to take proper care of these instruments and get them repaired or serviced periodically.

7. Selection of the students to particular trades is done by the school authorities. In all matters the decision of the Principal is final.

8. No student shall make use of the equipment or instruments for training in the absence of the teacher concerned. Any damage done to any instruments or equipments shall be made good by the one who is responsible.

9. All students will be provided with Computer training Diploma in Computer course at Grade V.

STUDENTS ORGANISATIONS FOR SOCIAL SERVICES (S.O.S)

All students of the school shall be members of this organization. Funds raised by students will be used to help economically poor students in their studies.

Students in groups will be organised to help the children of neighbouring village in their studies. Visits to villages help to learn about their conditions which are a compulsory part of their training.

SCHOOL MAINTENANCE:

The school collects no separate school fee. But an annual maintenance fee is collected as a voluntary contribution for payment of teachers and maintenance of the school by the Trust which runs the institution. This amount will be based on the requirements for the year.

1. Payment of the staff. (Vocational and Academic)

2. Stationery requirements and other maintenance.

MODE OF PAYMENT:

Nursery: The above annual contribution towards staff payments and maintenance may be paid in one sum or in installments according to the choice of parents.

1. Annual: In one sum: before 30th May

2. Installments:

1. Before 31st March

2. Before 10th October

After each Semester/trimester Progress Reports will be issued to all pupils. They should receive them from their class teachers, show them promptly to their parents and return them to their class teachers after obtaining parent's signature in the space provided in the progress report within 2 days from the date of issue.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

20 Marks for each subject will be given as internal assessment for each semester. There will be no internal assessment for Moral Science. General Knowledge and any other subjects which may be listed and announced in the course of the year.

Internal assessment consists of

- a) A project in any subject (No assignment in that subject need to be done
- Assignment suggested by teachers in other subjects. There may be a minimum of 3 assignments in each subject.
- c) Languages: There will be 3 assignments and oral Test.12 marks for assignment. 8 marks for oral test.

MONTHLY TESTS & EXAMINATIONS

The following examination will be conducted during the year

1st Semester - October

2nd Semester – March

PROMOTION RULES:

Promotion will be decided from class to class on the basis of the achievement of a pupil at the semesters/trimesters and the internal assessments.

For promotion to the next higher class, a student should have scored a minimum of 40% marks in each of the academic subjects and C grade in physical education.

A student who does not get promoted is detained in the same class. Students, who fail consecutively for two years in any class, will be asked to leave the school. The school authorities cannot on any account re-admit such students to the same class.

STUDY TIPS TO PUPILS:

- 1. Get all your doubts in a subject cleared. Do not hesitate to ask questions to your teacher. She/he is there to help you.
- 2. Understand everything. Do not learn by rote as that is soon forgotten.
- 3. Keep your books covered and tidy. Write neatly as you may be often judged by your writing.
- 4. Do not miss your classes or your homework as a gap once made grows larger pushing you behind in the class.
- 5. Always date your work.
- 6. If memory work is assigned, learn it first in the early morning.
- 7. Use your diary. Note down your homework or any other matter you wish to remember.

PICNIC, FIELD TRIPS, EXCURSIONS:

- 1. School picnic will be conducted in the month of February.
- 2. FIELD TRIPS: With a view to enabling the pupils to visit a few places of local importance, Field trips will be arranged at the level of each class.
- 3. Excursion: Month of September or in April.

N.B: Excursions are optional. Parents who are interested may send their children for this. Required amount will be announced and collected two months in advance.

SCHOOL DAY AND SPORTS DAY:

School day in March Sports day in August

PARENT-TEACHER-STUDENT MEETINGS:

With a view to providing a common platform for both teachers and parents to discuss the academic matters pertaining to their wards, Parent-teachers meeting will be held in the school during the academic year Time and date will be informed.

DAILY ROUTINE OF STUDY AT HOME (MORNING)

- 1. Rising at 5.30 a.m. Prayer/Exercise/Yoga/Karate
- 2. Check the time table/notebooks/textbooks/for the day.
- 3. Quick revision of the subjects of the day. Read ahead the new lesson which is going to be taught during the day. Bring to the notice of the teachers if you have collected any material related to the new lessons.
- 4. Whatever you have revised, try to recollect with the help of questions related to each lesson. Try to write down the answers if there is time.

IN THE EVENING:

- On reaching home relax for 45 minutes. Revise the day's lessons quickly. Check through the important questions, Try to write the answers by yourself without looking in the books. If you have time, spend some time on difficult subjects.
- 2. Spend some time on personal reading and hobby
- 3. You may watch the news on T.V. Keep the books for the next day's subjects ready before going to bed.

AT SCHOOL:

- 1. As you reach, keep your mind recollected in silence. Quickly go through the subjects of the day.
- 2. Share your knowledge with your companions. Get help from students who know better.
- 3. You are given time to do your homework in the school After having done the homework go through the lesson taught during the day. If you find any difficulty consult your teacher and get the doubts cleared before you go home.

ON HOLIDAYS:

- 1. Get up as usual. Do the exercises.
- Divide your time for each subject, so that quick revision is completed. Check whether you can recollect what you have read. While revising, concentrate on what you don't

remember. First revise weekly lessons. If you have time, go for monthly and complete revision. Conduct a self-test to know how much you have grasped.

- 3. Spend some time for personal, general reading, letter writing and hobbies.
- 4. You can watch T.V. for some time, for educative and useful information. Do not watch anything that distracts your mind in any way. Instead you can play and get yourself refreshed.

DURING EXAMINATIONS:

- 1. Think positively, Always tell yourself that you have the ability to perform extremely well in the examinations.
- Do not allow tension, nervousness or Exam-fear to upset you. Remain calm, confident and cheerful. If you have studied well through the year you will certainly do well exam.
- 3. Have a good sleep on the previous night of the exam. This will help you to concentrate better on the day of your exam.
- 4. Stop all reading and learning activity at least 30 minutes before the exam actually starts. This will help you in keeping your mind fresh, calm and relaxed, making you perform to your optimum / best level of performances.
- 5. In the examination room, read all the questions carefully, before you answer them.
- 6. Remember to write down the following details properly, without scratches:

a) Your Full Name with initials in complete capital letters. For example,

-Vijay P.N. - Rohini T.L. etc.

- b) Your Class, Section and Roll Number.
- c) The Main and Question numbers correctly.
- 7. Attempt all questions. Answer them in a neat handwriting.
- 8. After writing all the answers, revise and check the spellings and facts thoroughly.


